# **July Meeting Notes:**

The "business" portion of the July meeting was brief to allow time for the demo by Heather Fountain.

- There were no membership changes of note.
- Kathy gave an update on the successful July SBA show in Ocean Park. While two exhibitors were unable to come in the end, it was a good crowd, beautiful day, and a fun parade. Russel Whitten, who judged the show, was very conscientious in his comments on the winners, which we share here. We'd love to be able to get him to host a workshop for SBA!
  - First Joyanna Margo; for Aloha Ke Akua abstraction that glows from across the lawn; great use of complementary colors and strong composition; very painterly; very memorable

- Second Rebecca Benkowski; for House of Seven Gables subtle hues that work well together for an overcast day; use of foreshortened perspective places the viewer at this location with the unexpected fence in the foreground; very smart photo
- Third Heather Fountain; for Ebb Tide #4 made with layers of glass, these nestled stones appear as if wet; a beautiful feel of movement from the soft transition of color on the far right edge looks as though it was created by water
- Bill Edmunds Photography Award Joe Rokowski; for Lines of Life strong overall composition; blacks and whites that move from positive to negative space; fine detail that tells a story; great movement, most memorable
- Honorable Mention: Debra Grubbs for entire tent consistent vision; good overall understanding of light, composition and perspective
- Honorable Mention: Anne Alexander for entire tent great understanding of natural forms as they appear in nature; masterful use of clay medium and glass
- Honorable Mention: Cynthia Holmes aka Loom Lady tent very delicate work that is masterful and flawless; great amount of detail and focus
- Kathy also talked briefly about the August show. SBA will host a tent in which members may exhibit works. Four members have registered so far, so contact Kathy if you are interested (<u>kathyangellee@gmail.com</u>). The August show will also have several additional prizes beyond the usual slate:
  - o 2 "purchase prizes" of \$300 each sponsored by local banks who will purchase the works
  - Elizabeth ("Betty") Horton Shore Award for Oil Pastel will be awarded for the first time. This annual \$100 award has been funded with money donated by the disbanded Oil Pastel Society of Maine (OPSOM) and will be given each year at the August show in memory of OPSOM member, Betty Shore. Sylvia has been in contact with Betty's daughter about the award and will notify her of this year's winner.
  - Suggestions were made to use colored stickers to identify the oil pastel works for the judge and also to indicate the purchase prize winners.
- Sylvia provided an update on portrait sketching (see section below) and Kathy mentioned the "Intro to Traveling Sketchbook" workshop hosted by Mary Byron in Ocean park on the lawn by the bandstand on August 3 from 10:30-11:30. More information can be found in the Ocean Park event booklet.

## Demos


At the July meeting, Heather Fountain (Fountain Glass) hosted a fascinating and highly informative demo entitled, "You're Getting Warmer: The Fine Craft of Warm Glass." Heather helped educate our group on the differences in the methods and materials for cold, warm and hot glass. She specializes in warm glass, which involves heating between 1200-1700 degrees. She reviewed some of her techniques such as slumping, polishing, and various fuses, as well as materials, which included powdered glass, frit, rods and stringers. Even the types of food-safe Bullseye Glass she uses can produce different effects since some can react with one another based on their elemental composition. She noted some of the "rules of glass", such as its tendency to break in straight lines (which made her demonstration of cutting a circle with glass so interesting!) and its desire to retract to 6mm thickness once heated. Heather is active on Facebook and Instagram and is a member of the Maine Crafts Association.













In August, our demo will be hosted by artist and writer, Steve Hrehovcik, who will be doing a caricature demonstration. He's asked that attendees bring drawing paper, a pencil or pen, and an "improver" (eraser!) to the demo and he promises to make it fun.

Some background on Steve... he works in pen and ink, acrylics, charcoal, pencil and colored markers. His subjects include homes and buildings, portraits, equestrian art and pets, scenic views and caricatures. While working in advertising and industrial design he widened his expertise to include computer. Steve studied art and design while a theater major at Rutgers University, the University of Miami and Catholic University. He has continued his art education at the Maine College of Art and the Heartwood College of Art. On trips, rather than using a camera, he prefers to capture the memories on a sketch pad.



Important visual influences in Steve's art embrace the freedom of the Impressionists, the dramatic fantasies of Boris Vallejo, the wholesome fun of Norman Rockwell, the romantic danger of Howard Pyle, the daring architecture of Frank Lloyd Wright, the fluid lines of Al Hirschfeld's Broadway caricatures and the glamorous spectacle of the old MGM musicals.

Ellen is seeking volunteers to host demos during our monthly SBA meetings during the remainder of 2022. And you get paid for it too! You are encouraged to show us how you make your art, but if you prefer not to "perform," a demo related to your art/technique, tips of the trade, history/influencers, etc. would be just as valuable. So feel free to get creative!
