Odilia "Teddy" Ngalamulume, a senior at Scarborough High School, has been accepted to the animation program at Champlain College. She talked about how she approaches her work and what has been important to her as an artist.



- Vicky Lowe gave the membership report: currently 73 members with no new additions this month
- Cathy T gave the treasurer's report; the ending balance is approximately \$11K
- Kathy Angel Lee gave an update following the final SBA show of a successful 2024 season:
 - \circ $\,$ All 39 spots were full for the Labor Day weekend show
 - o Kathy had been actively recruiting new fine artists over the past year to participate
 - She will hand over show planning to Mary Brunner for 2025 and beyond
 - The following are the award winners from the Labor Day weekend show and comments from judge Pam Edwards, president of Maine Women in the Arts:
 - **Best in Show** Kailleigh Archibald for well composed, classic botanicals which show mastery of multiple media
 - First Fine Art Joyanna Margo for vibrant and engaging layered work
 - Second Fine Art Michael Murray for Triptych; spectacular images and innovative presentation
 - Honorable Mention Fine Art tie for Eric Darling (rope art) and Chad Creighton (wood). Both artists use reclaimed materials in professional, beautifully designed visual pieces.
 - First Fine Craft Heather Fountain, impressive combination of techniques and textures
 - Second Fine Craft Anne Alexander for beautifully executed variety of pieces
 - Honorable Mention Richard Winslow for gorgeous surfaces on pottery, good variety of other crafts
 - Bill Edmunds Photography Award Don Withers for well executed, intimate nature portraits
- The SBA art show at the Libby Library in OOB is now hung. Participating arts have 28 works on display until October 3 (reminder: pick up is Friday October 4 between 5-6 pm). See photos in the events section below.
- The annual OOB/Ocean Park holiday art walk will take place Saturday, December 7.

Upcoming Guest Presenters

October 21 Meeting - Amalia Tagaris

Amalia is a Boston based artist, trained in professional photography at the New England School of Photography and is self-taught in encaustic (beeswax + damar resin + colored pigments) and mixed media art.

Her introduction to painting with encaustic was in 2009 where she began the application of the encaustic medium onto her photographs to produce works with luminous, textural qualities.

Today, she continues the exploration of the medium by incorporating oil paint, inks, carbon prints and a variety of other mixed media in my paintings. In addition, she uses a variety of fine art paper to create unique and lively encaustic monotypes.



A true New Englander with European roots and traditions, her perspective is enriched by the marriage of both worlds. Her subject matter is highly intuitive, informed by past experiences as well as her current state of mind and place. She stated that, "I oscillate between urban and natural landscapes, abstract compositions and sometimes find pleasure in investigating unassociated subjects such as colorful koi fish and bold, floral compositions. The versatility of this ancient medium allows it to adopt various materials within its own skin to reveal an entirely new meaning. It also allows me to infuse bold, luscious colors and textures onto what would otherwise be a flat surface. The tactile property of the wax demands physical interaction during the process of scraping, incising and smoothening of its surface, layer after layer. Quite often, there is something extraordinarily beautiful that arises from these unplanned happenings which makes working with encaustic very appealing in expressing my visual narrative."



We are still looking for artists or suggestions for November and December and our presenters typically receive a \$100 honoraria.
